B. Communication Committee - Director Archer reported on the Friday, November 20 Meeting. The committee is working on two policies – BEDH – Public Participation at Meetings and BDB – the agenda. They are looking to improve policies in respects to community involved and engagement.

C. Facilities Committee –

1. Architect Search – Director Smith said the committee met on October 27th for the purpose of interviewing the three finalists chosen to conduct a facilities utilization study for RSU21. Harriman and Associates were chosen by the committee to do the study. The time frame for the study will be four-six months, and the Facilities Committee is asking the full board to authorize the committee to continue to negotiate a contract with Harriman. Superintendent Dolloff said the money approved for the study in the stimulus fund package is between \$90,000-\$100,000, and there are specific rules on how and when this money must be spent. Harriman's estimate came in between \$75,000-\$80,000, and Superintendent Dolloff will negotiate the contract with Harriman. A chart was distributed to the board detailing how the study will work. The Facilities Committee, with input from the Board, will discuss options with Harriman, and Harriman will advise whether the options are feasible. There is no pre-determined path at this point. The Facilities Committee will eventually take the information provided by Harriman and make a recommendation to the full board at the appropriate time. The Facilities Committee and the Strategic Plan Committee will work closely together. **MOTION: TO AUTHORIZE THE FACILITIES COMMITTEE TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACT NOT TO EXCEED \$90,000 WITH HARRIMAN AND ASSOCIATES (JOHN SHAROOD), SECONDED: (GAYLE SPOFFORD). VOTED 10-0. STUDENT VOTE: 1-0.**

D. Curriculum Committee - Superintendent Dolloff reported the committee felt their focus should be on big picture topics such as trends in education, current research, and sharing of professional development. The committee does not feel it is appropriate to approve smaller items such as textbooks, core literature, and other items recommended by teaching staff and principals. Assistant Superintendent Manuel will work on revising the current Curriculum/Design Team Committee Policy. The committee was asked to suggest items for discussion at future meetings.

E. Finance Committee - Director Sharood reported that the key metrics were reviewed, and at this time, expenditures are at or below budgeted levels. The Finance Committee will bring budgeting recommendations to the board at the December 7 Board Meeting, and in turn the board can give guidance to the Administrative Team on the parameters that will be used for the next three year budgeting cycle. There was discussion about the curtailment money, and Superintendent Dolloff said there was action under way for current curtailment plans. Information on how much the curtailment will be should be released by the state on November 15.

F. Prevention Advisory Team - Superintendent Dolloff reported positive comments were made about homecoming and progress is being made to have safe events for all. He spoke of upcoming awareness events that PAT has scheduled for the schools and the community.

G. Maine School Board Association Conference – Directors Spofford, Reetz, Pam Richard-Wuerthner, and Superintendent Dolloff and Chairperson King attended several clinics at the conference. Director Spofford represented RSU21 as a delegate to the assembly. At the conference, Chairperson King presented a clinic on Superintendent Search’s and Assistant Superintendent Manuel presented a clinic on “Why Do the Job.”

H. Education Foundation Fundraising – Vice Chairperson Hussey gave a report on the phone-a-thon event. He was happy to report the phone-a-thon was a rousing success and wanted to recognize the great turnout of school administrators and teachers. Corning also deserved a lot of thanks for supplying the location and the phone banks. The foundational raised \$36,000-40,000 (approximate at this time) which includes a matching gift by an anonymous donor of up to \$13,000.
